Lets learn to GRAFT.

An event to support the Fruity Windermere project and learn how to graft your own fruit trees is being offered Sunday **13th March** at the **Ladyholme Centre**, starting at **10.30am**. There will be a talk about apples, particularly Cumbrian varieties and then Andy

and Brian who come from South Lakeland Orchard Group will be teaching people how to successfully graft fruit trees. This involves fixing a fruit variety of your choice on to a new rootstock to ensure healthy growth of the right sized plant. It is not difficult and is a cheap and

easy way to create your own fruit trees. Anyone who wishes to participate will need to bring a Stanley knife, carpet knife or sharp penknife; gardening gloves; and carrier bags to take the trees home in. It's **£3 entrance fee** and £6 for anyone wishing to take a tree home.

There is a lot of material out there that is currently going to waste that could be growing carrots (or

melons, rhubarb or beans) and not everyone can or will home compost.

The forums will be followed up by 2-3 days of free workshops to help you get a really flying start and we will be available to help and support after the workshops too. There is no commitment needed to attend the forum - if you decide it's not for you or not for right now that's fine. CAR CLUB

WINDERMERE TACT is looking towards setting up a pay-as-you-drive car club, and is looking for people willing to share their car to save money.

If you lease your car to the Car Club, you get:

- Free tax, insurance, repairs and maintenance
- 40 hours free usage per month, carried over if not used
- Car parked less than 1km away - possibly at your own home
- You will be paid 25% of any hourly usage revenue generated

in excess of £2000
A Car Club works by people joining and paying a membership fee and then using Club cars on an hourly basis. The cars can be booked by phone or on the internet. Car Clubs are popular as they save you money and reduce pressure on parking space. Kendal and Staveley are also looking at setting up similar schemes. Cars will be fitted with equipment to link in with a computerised booking system. The Windermere Car Club needs people who are willing to lease a

car to our system – could that be you?

TACT—Towards a Community Transition in Windermere, Bowness-on-Windermere and Troutbeck Bridge was formed in February 2010 as a response to a group of community members wanting to work more with sustainability issues & green awareness in the immediate area.

The intention was—and is – to create and work with local groups already doing this work to raise more awareness, opportunities and resources for the public to “get involved” - doing things in ways that are practical, ethical and fun-filled. At the same time to inspire others, support further transition projects—and basically keep working towards a vision of a resilient sustainable future.

Working with the Town Council, and supported by SLACC, amongst others, TACT has been working to create these events throughout the year, with a long term vision that extends into 2011, and beyond.

Fair Trade Fortnight 2011



Fairtrade Fortnight commencing February 27th 2011

® **Fairtrade Fortnight 2011** starts **27th February** and gives us a chance to ‘Show off our labels’ and shout about buying and using fair-trade products.

As written on the fair-trade website, ‘We want to load the FAIRTRADE Mark with meaning, telling them the tangible difference Fairtrade makes to producers.’ The site suggests a focus on cotton, making links to the fashion industry and ‘This year, let’s go further and explain why Fairtrade matters. By showing off the importance of Fairtrade to producers, the benefits of the Fairtrade

premium for local communities and the change Fairtrade brings, we’re giving more people in the UK more reasons to choose Fairtrade.’

In our local community we can become a part of this too by shopping for Fairtrade produce and when we receive guests how about we present them with fair-trade wine and cake! We are a fortunate community in that we have good shops that sell fair-trade produce, such as; Booths, Cooperative, Manuka and many others in Windermere and Bowness.
